I. GROUND RULES :

All events will be held in accordance with IAAF Rules except for the following:

- A. If it is semi – finals or heats and only eight (8) or less competitors/teams report at starting line, it will be run in the final schedule. Finalist will be based on eight (8) best times, in case of tie, position in heat will be considered. If the tie is still not broken, athlete in the heat with best time (1st placer, 2nd, 3rd, etc) qualifies.
- B. Each team may enter a maximum of two (2) athletes in each event and one (1) team in each Relay event.
- C. An athlete may enter a maximum of three (3) individual events and two (2) relays.
- D. In 1500m to 5000m, overlapped athletes by the lead runner is automatically eliminated from the race unless only sixteen (16) runners remain.
- E. Starting heights of the bar for high jump shall be discussed during the coaches meeting.
- F. Team championships will be based on the number of Gold, Silver and Bronze medals.
- G. No changes in entries will be entertained once competition starts except in relay where two (2) may be substituted from the official list of the six (6) relay team members.
- H. Age category:
13 to 15 years old or those are born on 2002 to 2004
- I. The Victory Ceremony shall be held at an appropriate and pre set moment after a competition or event. Athlete taking in the ceremony must wear appropriate track suit of their team and training shoes. (No slippers, clog or sandals). Athletes in improper uniform shall not be allowed to take part in the Victory ceremony and shall forfeit medals and points earned.
- J. Starting block is a must for all sprint events including hurdling events and relays.
- K. In the relays, Team Members must wear the same uniform, print, color (singlets or shirt).
- L. Lane assignments in the Final Rounds are as follows:
 - Lane 3 Fastest Time
 - Lane 4 2nd Fastest Time
 - Lane 5 3rd Fastest Time
 - Lane 6 4th Fastest Time

Lane 7 5th Fastest Time
 Lane 8 6th Fastest Time
 Lane 2 7th Fastest Time
 Lane 1 8th Fastest Time

IV. VENUE REQUIREMENTS

- A) 8 Lane synthetic surface track oval certified by PATAFPA as 400m track with two D-section with synthetic surface, steeplechase water jump and IAAF standard markings.
- 1) At least Javelin runway 40m long with line sectors.
 - 2) Long Jump/triple jump pit and runway with regulation take of boards for long jump and triple jump runway should at least be 40m.
 - 3) High Jump runway and landing mats.
 - 4) Discus circle /hammer circle with safety cage.
 - 5) Shot put circle with stop board and Line sectors.
- B) Grandstand and / or bleachers with cover and the following required rooms:
- 1) Technical Information Center and Results processing room with enough outlets, lights and air conditioned, tables and chairs.
 - 2) Dressing/ Shower rooms
 - 3) Toilets
 - 4) Media room
 - 5) Medical room
 - 6) Call room for the processing of athletes before going to their respective events.
 - 7) Warm up area
 - 8) Flood lights for night competitions
 - 9) Equipment storage to accommodate landing foams, hurdles etc.
- 2) Track Events requirements:
- a) judges / timekeepers stand **with roof** to accommodate 10 people
 - b) photo finish stand (scaffoldings, $\frac{3}{4}$ plywood and cover) -optional
- 3) Field events requirements
- a) chairs – 10pcs
 - b) benches - 10pcs
 - c) tables – 8pcs
 - d) tents – 5sets(8"x8")

4) Entries and Results management requirements

- a) computers – two sets with printer
- b) duplicating machine – 1 set
- c) electric fans if room is not air conditioned
- d) tables – 4pcs
- e) chairs – 8 pcs
- f) office supplies (2reams bond paper, pens, pencils, pentel pens, scissors, scotchs tape, 2stapler, staple wire)
- g) numerical race bibs (plain white background 1000 sets)
- h) 4 boxes safety pins

V. APPROPRIATE NUMBER OF NATIONAL TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Competition Director (1) – Overseas entire athletics planning and organization of competition

- coordinates with PSC and technical manager
- coordinates and over see functions of all officials
- trouble shoots problems and facilitates requirements
- signs official communications and results
- conducts seminars / refreshers course

Track Referee (1) - acts also as meeting manager as far as track events are concerned

- assigns and checks attendance of track officials
- ensure proper application of rules and procedures for track events.
- reviews and signs track events results
- warns and / or exclude athletes as needed
- rules on protests or objections regarding track events
- also conducts seminar / refreshers course

Field Referee (1) - Acts also as Meeting Manager as far as field events are concerned

- assigns and check attendance of field officials
- ensure proper application of rules and procedures for field events.
- resolves and decides upon any matter that arise involving field events.
- Reviews and signs field events results.
- warn and/or exclude athletes as needed.
- rules on protest or objection
- supervises and secures issuance of field events equipments.
- also conduct seminar/refreshers course

Call Room Chief Judge (1) - shall supervise the transit between the warm-up Area and the competition area to ensure that the athletes, after being checked in the Call Room.

Competition Secretary (1) - ensures and secures entries of teams

- prepares start lists
- collates, arranges and prepares officials results
- prepares correspondence and necessary paper works re: athletic competitions

Competition Encoder (1) – prepares IT program

- encodes start lists
- encodes heats and lane assignment
- encodes results
- assists competition secretary

Chief Timekeeper (1) – supervise timekeepers

- recommends or reassigns timekeepers placements
- collect and collates and signs timekeepers reports
- coordinates with track referee and photo finish judge
- acts also as Judge at finish
- submit results to competition secretary
- secures stopwatches and other equipment and supplies of timekeepers.

Chief Field Judge (1) – supervises field events officials

- recommends or reassigns field events officials
- collects and signs field events results
- coordinates with field referee
- acts also field judge
- submits results to competition secretary
- secures equipment of field events.

Chief Starter (1)

- supervises local starters, starter's assistant
- ensures that starts of track events are conducted properly according to Rules
- ensures that timetable of track events are followed
- warns or excludes athletes according to Rules
- secures equipments at the starting line

Chief Lane Umpire (1) – supervises the Lane umpires

- sees to it that lane umpires are assigned properly at their post during the track events
- acts also as Lane umpire during the meet
- collects lane umpires report for evaluation whether there was a violation during track events
- reports to track referee for disqualification of athletes for violation as reported by lane umpires

Chief Walk Official (1) – supervises walk judges

- checks attendance and reassigns walk judges
- disqualifies athletes for violation during the walk competition

Timekeepers (4) - Act as Judges at Finish and get individual times of each runner

Lane Umpires(4) - to Chief Lane Umpire possible violations in track events.

Competition Announcer (1) - announce the sequence of events ON Time

Photo Finish Judge (1) – shall responsible for the functioning of the System (photo finish camera)
Shall supervise the testing of the Photo Finish Camera

Photo Finish Operators (3) - ensure that the Photo Finish Camera is correctly aligned.

Lap Scorer (1) - Keep a record of the laps completed by all athletes in races

Call Room Judges (3) – shall ensure that athletes are wearing the national uniform.

Shall refer any unsolved issues or matters arising to the Call Room Referee

Asst. Starters (2) - shall check that the athletes are competing in the correct heat or race and that their bibs are worn correctly

Wind Gauge Operator (2) - Shall ascertain the velocity of the wind in the running direction in events to which he is appointed.

Shall then record and sign results obtained and communicate them to the competition secretary

VI. APPROPRIATE NUMBER OF LOCAL TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Seven (7) Timekeepers – Act as Judges at Finish and get individual times of each runner

Eight (8) Lane Umpires – Report to Chief Lane Umpire possible violations in track events.

Ten (10) field officials – acts as field events judges

- conduct field events according to rules

Two (2) starters / recallers – assist chief starter
- acts as starter as may be assigned

One (1) competition announcer – Announce the sequence of events ON Time
